

CarolinaCAP is a non-degree alternative pathway leading to full licensure for candidates in partner districts. This program provides a high-quality experience in teaching that marries the expertise of local teachers, schools, and districts with an institution of higher education and a national non-profit. CarolinaCAP focuses on innovative and cost-effective teacher recruitment strategies, customized training for new teachers, and dedicated, ongoing coaching support.

HELPING DISTRICTS GROW THEIR OWN

- More than three out of four CarolinaCAP candidates
 (77%) have previously served in non-certified
 roles. The model supports districts in growing existing
 numbers of their school communities into new, certified
 teaching roles.
- The program's support model focuses on elements that
 ensure each candidate becomes an effective teacher.
 This fall, CarolinaCAP is designing a residency
 pathway to extend clinical experience and strengthen
 preparation for Praxis exams.
- Among CarolinaCAP candidates, 74% are people of color and 19% are male. Diverse candidates ensure that students in CarolinaCAP districts are more likely to be served by a teacher who shares their background, an evidence-based approach to increasing student well-being and achievement.



STATEWIDE IMPACT

- The program's candidates have been placed in one of **78 schools** in the 26 **districts** participating in CarolinaCAP.
- CarolinaCAP candidates currently serve about 4,500 students across South Carolina.
- In the schools where CarolinaCAP
 candidates are eligible to be placed, 75%
 or more of the students are eligible for
 Free or Reduced Price School Meals. By
 design, the program targets the highest-need
 classrooms in the state.
